#### Watergate

Our Literacy is now based around persuasive adverts in the form of travel guides - the children will soon be writing their own using a range of skills on a place of their choice. In maths, we are still exploring fractions but are now looking at multiplying and dividing fractions and mixed mixed numbers. We have completed an exciting DT unit where the children carried out market research, created a specification designed, made and then evaluated their own energy rich snacks that a mountaineer could eat on an expedition.
