# What we have been up to...

### Holywell

In Holywell for Maths our Year 1s have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes, comparing the differences in their features, discussing how to group them and creating repeating patterns. Foundation have been showcasing their deepening knowledge of composition, counting and number formation. For science we have been learning about our senses and the body parts we need for them. We also had a go at experiencing what it may be like without our sense of sight through being blindfolded, allowing a partner to lead us around the class whilst feeling different objects to guess what they are. We have also been working hard during rehearsals for our Nativity play, and are starting to become very excited about performing it in front of our adults very soon!



# <u>Fistral</u>

This week in Fistral Class we have started a new book by Neil Gaiman- Odd and the Frost Giants, which is another great story based on the myths of Norway and Norsemen. In our IT session this week, we have had a lot of fun learning a new language to programme shapes and colours within coding! In History we have been working on timelines. In Science, fantastic investigation work into circuits his week too!



### <u>Tolcarne</u>

Tolcarne have been busy rehearing for the upcoming Nativity show and they are singing beautifully together already. We had a lovely decorating day making gifts for the church Christmas tree. We have moved onto our science topic now and are discovering all the different materials around us and their properties. In PE, we have been practising our balance using the apparatus equipment. In Literacy, we are beginning to write our diary entries as children escaping the Great Fire of London.



# <u>Watergate</u>

Year 5 have had a brilliant and adventure packed fortnight, they have been focusing on perimeter, shape and area within Maths. They have written a dystopian story using The Last Wild as their basis. In the afternoon, they have been focusing on their geography topic 'How are different countries around the world being effected by climate change?' This was finished off with a fantastic trip to The Eden Project to learn about what we can do together. They were so impressed by Year 5's posters they will being making a display in their Learning Zone!



### <u>Porth</u>

Fantastic participation with their learning from Porth class over the last 2 weeks! In Maths we have moved onto our multiplication and division unit of learning. This week the children have been looking at equal and unequal groups and how these can be represented using multiplication.

In Science we are learning about forces and magnets, the children carried out an investigation into which surfaces create the most friction and why.



**Crantock** 

We have had a brilliant fortnight in Crantock with a wide range of different types of learning.

As geographers, we have shown passion and perseverance when looking at mountains, why certain mountains are famous and creating scientific programmes for how mountains are formed.

Our Literacy is still based on the book The Boy in the Tower; the children have now almost finished writing their first drafts of their own dystopian stories.

In Maths, we are now exploring fractions and looking at different written and mental methods in order to be able to add and subtract mixed numbers.

We were very fortunate to be able to attend an indoor climbing workshop to begin to understand what it is like for mountaineers who are trying to reach the summit of different mountains around the world.
