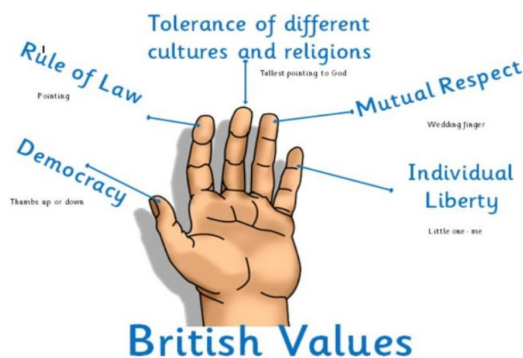
Dear parents/carers,

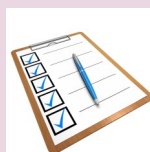

Tolcarne

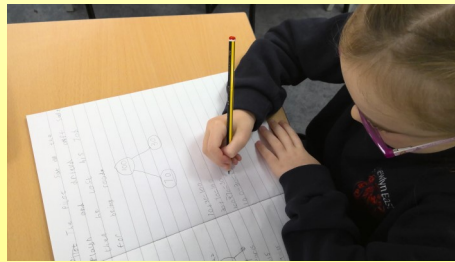
Tolcarne have returned enthusiastically to school!
